

AUTHOR GUIDELINES

Quality

Research article must be double-blind reviewed according to the support society's strict standards. Article should preferably be sent to 3 reviewers (2 minimum) and must amend according to their comments. If one reviewer accepts the article and one rejects it, the decision of the third reviewer is final. Editors should retain the referees' reports till the article gets published. The Publisher reserves the right to re-review or reject an accepted article if it does not meet the criteria outlined in the review form or if it is not suitable.

Also, there should be a balance of article topically, and accounts must be taken from the status and credibility of the research centres from where the submitted articles are accepted and published.

Conference Research Article(s)

It is not unusual for articles to be submitted based on conference articles which may have been published elsewhere. These articles require special care. It is essential to observe the following in considering submissions based on those:

- The Author must ensure that he/she has cleared any necessary permission with the copyright owner in the original if the original Conference Article is published elsewhere or the copyright assigned to the conference organizers or another party. Article submitted to the Journal will not be accepted unless the Author obtains such permissions.
- The submitted article must be substantially revised, expanded, and rewritten to be significantly different from the Conference article or presentation on which it is based. The article must be sufficiently different to make it a new, original work. It is unlikely to be the case if less than 50% of the article is new. It is a matter of judgment based on a comparison of the submitted article with the original Conference Article.
- The article must contain a statement fully acknowledging the original Conference Article:

This article is a revised and expanded version of an article entitled [Conference Article title] presented at [name, location, and date of conference].

Submission Guidelines

All accepted articles will be published online and available on the JCJLP's website. An original article would generally consist of 5,000-8,000 words (excluding figures, tables, and references), although high-quality articles which exceed 8,000 words will be considered. The Short or Long article must contain an Abstract of 250-350 words with 5-6 Keywords. Refer to '**Submission Checklist**' to download the template file.

Word Limit for Submissions:

Long Articles: An article must comprehensively analyze the issue that the author seeks to highlight. It must contain a rigorous study of the contemporary issue in any area of Law. A long article should be between 5,000-8,000 words.

Short Articles: An essay challenges existing paradigms/norms and provides a fresh outlook to common problems. It is strongly recommended that essays be considerably more concise than articles, in terms of scope and conceptualization. A short article must thus ideally be between 2,000-5,000 words.

Case Comments: A case comment allows the author to critique any recent/landmark judicial pronouncement, legislation, or a pending bill. The word limit for a case comment is 1,500-2,500 words.

Book Reviews: The book review must be written in a concise manner. The word limit for book review is 1000-2,000 words.

Once the authors submit the first draft of their article, they will be communicated within 15–20 days the outcome of the reviewing process and any changes requested by the reviewers. After that, the authors shall resubmit the final manuscript within 10 days with modifications suggested by the reviewers.

Review Process

A. Verification and Editorial Review

All submitted articles should go through a verification and editorial review (the plagiarism, quality, and research topic check). Research should deal with legal and

public policy aspects. Only relevant and high-quality article should be processed and sent to reviewers. The article should not have more than 20% similarity, including references and 10% excluding references. Once the submitted article qualifies, three experts will verify and review it.

B. Review Process

All qualified articles will undergo the double-blind peer-review process. Out of three experts, if two reviewers accept the article, the same is considered for selection. However, if they accept the article BUT the article only scored marginal or just acceptable for Originality, Quality, Relevance, Presentation, and Recommendation, the editor should reject it to meet the standard of the Journal. If two reviewers reject the article, the Author should consider it a rejection. If two reviewers disagree, the third reviewers' decision shall be final.

Publication Process

The Publisher reserves the right to do a final review, i.e., final acceptance of the article is subject to this final review process which is a part of the Publisher's quality assurance process before publication.

The final manuscript of each selected articles should include:

- Title of the Article, Authors' Names, Affiliations, complete Addresses, and E-mail Ids.
- The name, address, e-mail id, and fax number of the Corresponding Author.
- A brief abstract.
- 5-6 keywords.
- High quality and high-resolution figures suitable for printing high quality figures in black and white.
- Each article must have the JCIJLP Author Agreement (Copyright form) completed by the Author. If an article has more than one Author, each Author must sign a Copyright Form. It is not acceptable for one Author to sign on behalf of all authors. As stated above, article will not be processed unless a signed Copyright form from each Author is attached to it.
- Brief biographical notes about the authors.

If article have been refereed and accepted, and sent for typesetting, the authors have to abide by what they have written; no further changes are acceptable in:

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- The content of the article (except for typesetting corrections).

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
